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STUDENT TELEVISION NETWORK CREATES CURRICULUM MATERIALS *International Standards for Broadcast Journalism and Film Have Been Released*

CARLSBAD, CA – Student Television Network, an international association of high school and middle school broadcast journalism, film and media programs, has announced the release of educational standards for broadcast journalism and film programs.

Many of the schools have been seeking a standard that will satisfy requirements for Common Core and Career and Technical Education career pathways recognized in various states. The Standards, created by teachers on the STN Board of Directors' Curriculum Committee, address the fundamentals for both broadcast and film.

"This is just the beginning of a comprehensive program for all STN schools to implement and expand," said Nancy Held Loucas, CEO. "This is a key tool for our member programs and we look forward to feedback as it is employed nationwide."

In addition to the Standards, STN will also be releasing Lesson Plans that directly connect to the Standards. This will provide the necessary link for teachers to track the progress of covering necessary topics.

Currently, Student Television Network works with over 400 schools internationally to support teachers and their students in broadcast journalism, film and multimedia. Each year, STN holds an annual convention attended by 12-18 year old students, their teachers and chaperones. Attendees take part in four days of education, interaction with peers and professionals, and competition. The 2019 convention will be held in Seattle, WA March 28-31.
