Basic Camera Shots and Angles

Project Summary

This lesson will show how to use a video camera to create interesting, creative, and meaningful shots. Basic camera shots and angles along with framing heights will be the primary focus in this one period lesson. Students will be exposed to a mixture of visual demonstrations, theory, artistic expression, note taking, and class discussion in this lesson.

3. Practice finding two stories directed at different audiences.
